I am very pleased to inform you that Langford Islamic College has invested in a new Learning Management System called SEQTA. SEQTA is an all-in-one collaborative teaching and learning ecosystem.

SEQTA Engage is the College's Parent Portal for ALL Parents, allowing parents to log into the College's learning management system (SEQTA) to obtain all the information you desire about your child/ren on a daily basis from home.

All parents will be given log in details to SEQTA Engage in Term 3, Insha-Allah. Through this, parents can access important information about their child/ren whenever they wish using any computer, tablet or smart phone.

By logging into SEQTA Engage, parents can:

- view their child's timetable
- view their child's homework schedule
- gain details of upcoming assessments
- view test/assessment results and teacher comments
- view their child's reports
- view their child's attendance history
- find out about unexplained absences
- obtain an overview of their child's pastoral care (including any behavioural issues, extra-curricular activities and awards received)
- receive daily notices from their child's teachers
- receive letters/memos to parents, college notices etc.
- College/parents communication (direct messages)

From Semester Two onwards, reports will be emailed to parents via SEQTA, Insha-Allah. Parents will receive hard copies of Semester One reports at the beginning of Term 3.




Reading is the key to success!

We use punctuation pencils to help us practise our capital letters and full stops.




Mathematics




The Year 2 student welcomed the month of Ramadan, in little notes, by expressing their love and eagerness for the commencement of the Mubarak month of Ramadan.

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
Numeracy was taught through concrete hands-on activities, number rhymes, which were both through structured and incidental learning.



Out of 16 amazing designs, the High School IT Department had to select only the three best Eid Cards to be used for this year's Ramadan.




