

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Art is an important part of the school curriculum. It teaches students different and unique ways of seeing the world around them, as well as how to communicate with that world. Art can make a statement, tell a story, or ask a question. By learning how to understand what art is telling them, students are better equipped to make sense of the world around them.

The Year 7 and 8 students have been taught about different ways to view nature and the natural world. Year 8s looked at how to visualise the texture of leaves and flowers using lino cutting and printing techniques. Year 7s studied the work of Noongar artist Bella Kelly and her famous composition style. They then created their own beautiful watercolour paintings of nature, which were displayed at the Ramadan Assembly alongside the Year 8 lino printing.

Year 9s this year have learnt about working from still life. Semester one focused on brand logos and pop art, while Semester 2 has seen them paint still life fruit and flowers in an Impressionist style.


The year 10 classes leant about collaborative art, creating large drawings and paintings by combining many smaller pictures drawn and painted by students across different classes. The centrepiece of the high school art exhibit at the Ramadan Assembly was their beautiful full moon painting.

As for Science, this term the focus was on Chemical Science. As part of our Science program, we enjoyed weekly cooking sessions


